

# Programme Notes

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#### Section I

# How we are renewing Kaduna State



It is with immense pleasure that I welcome you all to Kaduna State. This event celebrates the milestones so far achieved in our sustained efforts at a comprehensive

remake of Kaduna State. We came into office in 2015 having campaigned on a Restoration Masterplan, our manifesto that gave muscle to our slogan of Making Kaduna Great Again. We have kept faith with our manifesto commitments. We are making Kaduna great again. We are restoring it to the dreams of its founders and all whose hard work and vision laid the ancient foundations on which we are building.

We launched the Urban Renewal Programme in June 2019 to provide the organised framework for the most extensive urban renewal programme in the history of Kaduna State. The projects of our urban renewal programme are designed to improve the competitiveness of Kaduna State, support economic dynamism and promote the well-being of our people. It seeks to make the major cities of Kaduna State a friendly home to their residents, pleasant places to live in, equipped with the facilities to support and promote the livelihoods of our citizens.

The Urban Renewal Programme responds to the accelerated urbanisation of Kaduna State. For instance, the metropolitan limits of the state capital, Kaduna, now straddles four local government areas: Kaduna North, Kaduna South, Chikun and Igabi. This metropolitan area is projected to be home to more than half of the state's population by 2050

The state government initiated an unprecedented series of investments in urban infrastructure Kaduna, Kafanchan and Zaria. These train major cities have grown tremendously in recent decades. But public infrastructure in these cities has not kept pace with the vast increase in their populations nor has it accompanied its expansion into new districts.

The roads captured in the Kaduna State Urban Renewal Programme represent a significant investment in the present and the future of our cities. Constructed with markings, solar lighting and shoulders, these. roads open up our cities, connect communities, create alternative roads and reduce travel time. Road upgrades have a multiplier effect on housing, business and social development. It is also expected to promote integration across communities and enhance unity.

Many of the road projects of the urban renewal programme have been completed, and already made available for the use of our people and the businesses that have made our state home. Mr. President is a long-term resident of Kaduna, and we most delighted

and grateful that he is commissioning projects designed to regenerate Kaduna, Kafanchan and Zaria.

We have built strong partnerships with the private sector in our state over the years as part of our determined quest for progress and development. In recognition of the vital contributions of investors in our state, Mr. President will also be commissioning the new vehicle assembly plant of Dangote-Peugeot, a joint venture in which the Kaduna State Government and the Kebbi State Government are minority but committed shareholders. We recall with gratitude that in September 2017 Mr. President personally commissioned the Olam project, an investment that signalled that our determined efforts to market the prospects of Kaduna State were being taken seriously.

The Urban Renewal Programme builds on the investments in infrastructure during the first term. Physical infrastructure complements the sustained focus on human capital development and governance reforms that we began right from our first week in office backin 2015.

The investments in urban infrastructure in Kaduna, Kafanchan and Zaria have demonstrated conclusively that our major cities have to be managed as organic, integrated cities. Kaduna metropolis straddles four local government areas:

Kaduna North, Kaduna South, Chikun and Igabi. Zaria embraces Sabon-Gari and Zaria, and parts of Giwa and Soba LGAs. Kafanchan includes parts of Jema'a, Kaura and Zangon-Kataf LGAs. That created a situation wherein no specific authority was directly responsible for these cities. We have tried to remedy the situation by creating metropolitan authorities to manage and sustain each of these cities.

The Kaduna State House of Assembly has passed the laws establishing the Kaduna Capital Territory Authority, the Zaria Metropolitan Authority and the Kafanchan Municipal Authority. I have assented to the laws and appointed the pioneer set of administrators for three metropolitan authorities: Hafiz Bayero for Kaduna, Phoebe Sukai Yayi for Kafanchan and Balaraba Aliyu-Inuwa for Zaria.

Mr. President, I wish to express our gratitude to the people of Kaduna State for supporting the delivery of these projects for the benefit of the entire state. Many of our people have borne the inconveniences of construction, including the removal of buildings and attachments in the public interest. Several have been constructive in matters of compensation and in reporting saboteurs. We are very grateful.

# **Remarks by the Deputy Governor**



The APC Administration in Kaduna State has since 2015 prioritized infrastructure development as a cardinal principle for promoting the wellbeing of citizens,

promoting economic activities and supporting livelihoods. In June 2019, a month into his second term, Malam Nasir El-Rufai launched the Urban Renewal Programme as an unprecedented investment infrastructure upgrade for Kaduna, Kafanchan and Zaria, the three major cities in the state. Rooted in the aspirations for modernity and progressive outcomes detailed in its manifesto, the urban renewal programme seeks to upgrade and expand infrastructure to meet the growing needs of Nigeria's third largest state by population.

In conception and execution, the urban renewal programme also recognises the highly urbanized nature of Kaduna State, with Kaduna metropolis alone estimated to have between 3 and 4 million residents. The Max Lock masterplans of 1967 and 2010 for Kaduna city provide a useful guide for the emphasis of the urban renewal programme has placed on accelerating the opening up of the eastern sector and the provision of adequate connectivity between the western and eastern sectors of an expanding metropolis. This comprehensive renewal of our major urban centres also draws on the Kaduna State Infrastructure Master Plan (KADIMP), developed by this administration as

coordinated blueprint for purposeful longterm infrastructure development. It is an obligation to replace rickety infrastructure and build new ones to support the current population and the projected demography of our state.

Designed to reduce the infrastructure deficit in the state, the urban renewal programme has 14 components. This includes Roads, Mass Transit, Housing, Street Lighting, Parks & Recreational Centres, Markets & Neighbourhood Centres, Waste Management and improved land use. The Kaduna State Government believes that the provision of modern infrastructure in these sectors is vital expanding investment opportunities, job creation, enhancing Internally Generated Revenue for Government and improving the comfort of citizens as the live and work in the state.

Many of the projects initiated under the Urban Renewal Programme have been completed and are ready for commissioning. Others are in various stages of completion, but this Administration is committed to full completion of all components of the Urban Renewal Programme within the lifespan of this government. is As His Excellency, Malam Nasir El-Rufai has often said we intend to finish our tenure as strongly as we started.

# Remarks by the Commissioner, Ministry of Public Works and Infrastructure



What any visitor will see as they approach the metropolitancities of Kaduna, Kafanchan and Zaria is the massive transformation and expansion of their road

networks. It is an unprecedented undertaking in Kaduna State for a government to so boldly confront and redress the overwhelming infrastructure deficit.

The idea of embarking on the Urban Renewal Programme is to address the needs of today and prepare our cities for the challenges of tomorrow. The population of Kaduna projected (based on 3.18% growth rate) to rise 12.96 million people by 2050. With rapid urbanisation, more residents of the state are now living in its major metropolitan areas. Between 3m and 4m persons are estimated to currently reside in the Kaduna metropolis alone.

The capacity of our cities to provide the infrastructure to support the business,

residential, recreational and other needs of this rising population has to be enhanced with deliberate investments. The road component of the Urban Renewal Road Projects will link up communities with a standard and durable road network. KDSG's Intervention in road infrastructure will yield positive result in tackling infrastructure decay, increase in socio-economic activities and accessibility to schools, hospitals, and markets etc.

The road component of the urban renewal programme was launched in June 2019, and actual construction activities commenced in on 23rd July 2019. The first phase of the programme started in Kaduna metropolis, but the programme is also being implemented in Kafanchan and Zaria.

Most of the roads upgraded within Kaduna metropolis are captured in the Kaduna Masterplans of 1967 and 2010. However, previous governments did not take steps for their construction or development. They might have been hindered either by insufficient funding or lack of political will.

The El-Rufai government recognised early on

that the sheer magnitude of the investments required for infrastructure development could not be provided from the usual revenue sources of internally generated revenues and allocations from the federation accounts.



# **The Kaduna State Urban Renewal Programme**

- remaking cities, making lives better

The Kaduna State Urban Renewal Programme is priority initiative of the second-term administration of Malam Nasir El-Rufai. Launched in June 2019, the urban renewal programme reflects the state government's strategic approach towards massive infrastructure development through a significant expansion, upgrade and construction of roads, recreational and retail spaces, housing and other facilities that restoring the magnificence, functionality and liveability of urban settlements. It is an unprecedented investment in the major cities of the state: Kaduna, Kafanchan and Zaria. For Kaduna city, it is the first comprehensive attempt since the creation of the state in 1967, to develop the city in line with the masterplans of 1967 and 2010.

The scope of the urban renewal programme includes substantial upgrades to existing regions in a bid to create more convenient urban spaces and transform the state's main cities into ideal locations for business and leisure.

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Components of the Urban Renewal Programmes (URP) includes:

- I. The dire requirement for investment in local economic development and the rehabilitation of neighborhoods and neglected infrastructure.
- II. The need for enhancements in low-income neighborhoods and
- III. The absence of planned extensions coordinate the expansion of the city

To this end, we identified the underlisted fundamental components to form the bases of the urban renewal movement:

- a. Road Expansion and Improvement:
- b. Streetlights and Traffic Lights
- c. Street Naming and House Numbering
- d. Markets
- e. Neighborhood Centers and Recreational Parks

# Remarks by the Administrator, Kaduna Capital Territory Authority

When our Governor, Malam Nasir Ahmad El-Rufai launched the Kaduna Urban Renewal Programme on the 27th of June 2019, very few understood the magnitude of the change it will bring to the urban landscape and the opportunities it will unleash. #### Murtala Square: a remodelled sporting and hospitality hub

The rehabilitation of Murtala Muhammed Square is a landmark project of the Urban Renewal Programme. The facility was developed to serve as a sporting and recreational centre for residents of Kaduna State and visitors alike. However, many of its facilities deteriorated due to years of mismanagement and neglect. The non-implementation of a sustainability plan after the upgrade of Murtala Square facilities for the KADA National Sports Festival in 2009 did not allow for the square to benefit from an organised programme of commercial viability and facility management.

The El-Rufai government charged the Kaduna Markets Development and Management Company (KMDMC) to revamp Murtala Muhammed Square and place it on a sustainable model. The remodelling includes the upgrade of the roads, tracks and drainage works within the complex, as well as the conversion of one of the pavilions to a boutique hotel and tech hub. Also, the former Taekwondo Hall was converted into an indoor sports hall, while a new clubhouse was constructed and many facilities upgraded.



#### Murtala Square - Conversion Of Pavilion To Boutique Hotel And Tech Hub

One of the pavilions at the square has been transformed into Boutique Hotel and Tech Hub which accommodate in line with His Excellency, the Governor's effort to digitize Kaduna.



Newly constructed high-end neighborhood centers along Racecourse Road by Murtala Square. Shop 54 and 56 comprise 33 and 43 shops respectively.





#### **Job Creation**

Through the Urban Renewal Programme, KDSG has created direct and indirect jobs across all 23 Local Governments. These include construction jobs for ongoing projects as well as operations maintenance of completed and activated projects, in which a significant sum of the labour force in Kaduna State is engaged. Jobs have been created for highly skilled professionals such as architects and engineers, as well blue-collar workers serving as truck drivers, construction artisans and cleaners, among others.
