





INTRODUCTION

The Ministry of Internal Security and Home Affairs serves as a bridge between the Kaduna State Government and federal security agencies, comprising the Military, Police, Department of State Services, and others. The Ministry engages in policy formulation and coordination of internal security of the state.

The Government has ardently pursued its commitment to inclusion, and broad engagement of citizens of the State in the campaigns against terrorism, banditry, kidnapping, wanton killings, reprisals, communal violence, and other forms of criminality.

Publication of regular security updates - and quarterly reviews - has been undertaken throughout 2022 to keep citizens of Kaduna State adequately and accurately informed about the security situation in the State, and to arrest the potential consequences of rumours and falsehoods. Reports such as this one have also proven to be of immense value to individuals and civil society groups, for planning, for academic research and relevant engagements.

The statistics presented are generated from daily reports of security agencies - the Military (the Army, Navy and Air Force), Police, Department of State Services (DSS), Nigeria Security and Civil Defence Corps (NSCDC), National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) and Kaduna State Vigilance Service (KADVS) - community leaders (ward heads, village heads, district heads, chiefdoms, and emirates) and credible human intelligence networks. The figures presented here by the Kaduna State Government therefore constitute the most authoritative source of periodic security data on banditry, terrorism, and other incidents in the State.



SUMMARY OF BANDITRY INCIDENTS FROM 1ST JANUARY TO 31ST DECEMBER 2022

This report is an overview of the security situation in the state for the entire year 2022, alongside efforts of the Kaduna State Government to mitigate or remove threats.

This report presents the statistics of banditry incidents in the year 2022, with information from the fourth quarter of the year provided for context.

The report covers banditry and terrorism, kidnapping, rape perpetrated by armed bandits, cattle rustling, communal and interethnic clashes, violent attacks, and reprisal attacks. It contains statistics of fatalities resulting from these incidences, excluding deaths from homicide and accidents not connected to the crimes hitherto listed. It also includes statistics of persons injured in these attacks. The report shows the casualty figures by gender and their status as adults or minors.

The report includes statistics of **bandits/terrorists neutralized** during engagements with ground forces (the Military, Police, DSS and other agencies).

The report excludes casualties suffered by of security personnel in the line of duty.

The total number of deaths linked to banditry, terrorism and other forms of violence in 2022 is **1,052.** This comprised **947 men**, **82 women** and **23 minors**.

Kaduna Central Senatorial District suffered **641** deaths from banditry, terrorism, communal violence, violent attacks and reprisal attacks.

Giwa LGA recorded 180 deaths, and Kajuru LGA had 121. Birnin Gwari LGA recorded 120 fatalities in 2022, and Chikun LGA 116.

Southern Kaduna Senatorial District accounted for **349** deaths (about one-third of the total), due to a mix of communal clashes and reprisals, alongside banditry.

These incidences accounted in large part for the **94** deaths recorded in **Kaura LGA** and **81** in **Zangon Kataf LGA**. **Kachia LGA** suffered **84** deaths in 2022.


In the period under review, the Northern Senatorial District recorded **62** fatalities from banditry and violent attacks, with **15** of those occurring in **Lere LGA.**







KIDNAPPING

From the **4,227** people kidnapped in 2022, Kaduna Central Senatorial District accounts for **3,112**. Of that number, **2,417** were kidnapped within **Birnin Gwari, Igabi, Giwa and Chikun** local government areas. **Kajuru LGA** had **691** kidnapped persons in the period under review.

925 persons were kidnapped in the Southern Kaduna Senatorial District; **629** of these from **Kachia LGA**, **102** from **Kagarko LGA** and **69** from **Jema'a LGA**. **Kauru LGA** recorded 59 persons kidnapped, **Sanga LGA 38** and **Zangon Kataf LGA 22**.

The Northern Senatorial District saw **190** people kidnapped in 2022, with **72** of these from **Zaria LGA** and **42** from **Lere LGA**.


Of the total number kidnapped across the state in 2022, **1,395** were women and **226** were below the age of 18.



IN 2022, bandits were reported to have raped **25** victims across the state, with **13** of these being minors. The numbers are very likely higher, taking unreported cases into account.

Of the reported rape cases, **14** occurred in the Southern Kaduna Senatorial District.













TOTAL (2022) – 25 REPORTED CASES





INJURIES

Citizens injured across the state due to banditry, terrorism, violent attacks, reprisals, and communal clashes numbered **648** in total. **Fifty-seven (57)** of these were women, and **16** were below the age of 18.


Kaduna Central Senatorial District accounted for 322 of the total injured. Ninety-eight (98) of these occurred in Birnin Gwari LGA, with 69 injured in Chikun LGA and 61 in Giwa LGA.

A total of **246** persons sustained injuries from banditry and violent attacks in the **Southern Kaduna Senatorial District. Fifty-six (56)** of these were in **Kaura LGA.**

Eighty (80) persons were injured in **Northern Senatorial District,** comprising four women.






RUSTLING

In 2022, **11,714** cattle were rustled across the state, with the Kaduna Central Senatorial District accounting for about **92%** of the total **(10,757). Kajuru LGA** saw **5,184** animals rustled, with **Giwa LGA** recording **2,402.**







DESTRUCTION OF FARMS

Various reports were received of farms destroyed by roving cattle in 2022.

These cattle could be in herds under the watch of itinerant herders, or herds rustled by bandits which destroy farms during escape.

In the year 2022, there were **215** reports received, relating to destruction of crops across the State, notably Birnin Gwari, Kajuru, Igabi, Giwa, Chikun, Jema'a, Kaura, Kauru and Zangon Kataf LGAs. The actual figure could be higher, taking unreported cases into account.

While the Kaduna State Government continues to ensure prevention, harmonious resolutions, and recourse to law, destruction of crops has exacerbated tensions in some frontline LGAs, many times resulting in violence. The Kaduna State Government is advancing efforts with local authorities and security agencies to ensure that peace is maintained.



OBSERVATIONS

- Intensified military action has progressed in frontline areas, despite
 a slight upward trend in attacks in the fourth quarter of 2022. The
 capacity of insurgents and bandits is being eroded by sustained
 clearance operations.
- The trend of malicious media campaigns and misrepresentations continued especially in the lead up to the general elections. A notable case involved the restriction placed on the use of a public facility requested for a political engagement. While this decision was taken based on compelling intelligence to forestall imminent violence, it was widely misrepresented in the media as part of a political vendetta.
- Isolated incidents of security import around the country tend to have knock-on effects in other states, not least Kaduna. Decisions have been taken to avert outbreaks of violence in the state in response to crises elsewhere. A notable religious killing which occurred in another Northern state is a key example. Threats of violent response in Kaduna State were promptly monitored and nipped in the bud.
- Reckless use of social media platforms and insensitive reportage by sections of the conventional media continue to affect security operations and endanger victims and communities.
- Links between bandits and terrorist groups such as Boko Haram, ISWAP and Ansaru are still being vigorously investigated and members tracked.
- Bandits and terrorists engage informants and collaborators to serve as logistic suppliers, couriers of arms and ammunition, and transporters of rustled animals.
- · Considerations of religion and ethnicity still taint security issues.



KADUNA STATE GOVERNMENT'S EFFORTS

BANDITRY AND TERRORISM

- The Kaduna State Government has continuously strengthened collaboration with federal security agencies. Robust clearance operations by the military are ongoing across several frontline areas. These operations have been supported closely by the Kaduna State Government with precise intelligence.
- Thanks to the vast intelligence network developed by the Kaduna State Government, many attacks have been thwarted by security agencies.
- Bandits have been neutralized during engagements with forces, arrests have been made, stashes of arms and ammunition have been recovered and gun-running networks continue to be dismantled.

FARMER-HERDER/COMMUNAL CLASHES

- In addition to the dedicated troops of Operation Safe Haven being deployed to the Southern part of the State, the Kaduna State Government has maintained peace building efforts at the grassroots, through the activities of the Local Government Peace Committees guided by the Kaduna State Peace Commission.
- These activities are geared towards ensuring that communities eschew violence and live together in harmony, irrespective of basic differences.
- The Ministry of Internal Security and Home Affairs promotes credibility in many security issues by releasing periodic security updates for the information of the public. This step helps curb the harmful spread of fake news, malicious rumors and misinformation on matters of security.



BANDITS NEUTRALIZED

In 2022, **more than 628** bandits were eliminated in a combination of ground engagements, aerial bombardments, and fratricidal clashes between rival groups.

280 bandits/terrorists were eliminated during engagements with ground forces (Military and Police) across the state.

48 bandits were killed in fratricidal clashes between rival groups of bandits or insurgents.

More than **300** bandits/terrorists were neutralized by air strikes on identified bandits' enclaves.

Notable among these was notorious bandit **Dogo Maikasuwa** who was eliminated by security forces in November 2022, in the Gengere-Kaso general area, around the Chikun-Kajuru boundaries. **Maikasuwa** led several deadly attacks on citizens and communities within the Chikun-Kajuru area, as well as on the Kaduna-Kachia Road.

Also neutralized in 2022 was bandit leader **Kachalla Gudau**, who – alongside associate, **Rigimamme** - was eliminated by troops in the Kankomi area of Chikun LGA.


Another bandit kingpin **Alhaji Shanono** was neutralized alongside about 17 gang members in an airstrike by assets of the Nigerian Air Force, around the Ukambo area of Chikun LGA.

By Ground Forces (Police/Military)




